The Freelance Programmes Facilitator will deliver workshops in schools and universities to both staff and students. The role will report to the CEO.

This is a freelance role, paid at £130 per day.

How to apply

If you are successful at the application stage, you will be invited to interview by email. Interviews will be held on 10 or 24 January 2024.

In order to safeguard young people, all roles that involve working in schools must pass several pre-employment checks. These include identity checks, safeguarding self-declaration, obtaining professional references, and enhanced DBS checks.
